Overview of MCC/MRC 's Mission, Purpose and Goals

Mission Statement

To assist town officials to prepare for and respond to a natural or man-made emergency such as influenza pandemic, bioterrorist event or hazardous weather conditions.

Purpose

- To provide a core of volunteers who can assist the town's public health and safety officials throughout the year but especially in times of an emergency
- To educate Maynard citizens about emergency preparedness

Goals

- To recruit and train qualified volunteers
- To establish and maintain communication with volunteers and the community as a whole
- To participate in town events as a means of recruiting new volunteers and educating the community on emergency preparedness
- To collaborate with neighboring towns and other town organizations as a means of preparing for a wide spread emergency.

Brief History: The Maynard Medical Reserve Corps (MMRC) was established in May 2006. At the Town Meeting in Oct. 2007 the MMRC became a component of the newly created Maynard Citizens Corps (MCC).

Executive Board: is governed and administered by 7 board members and Maynard's Health Officer, Kevin A. Sweet. The board meets monthly, working on obtaining MRC/ MCC 's goals.
