As you are aware, the laws and regulations regarding alcoholic beverages in the commonwealth change from time to time. 

**EXPLANATION**


Pursuant to Article 6, each officer of each shift working on the actual holiday is allotted four (4) hours of additional straight pay due to them actually having to work on the holiday. When an officer who was scheduled to work on a holiday uses a vacation day, calls in sick, is out injured, or there is an open shift on the holiday he does not get paid the four (4) hours additional pay. Therefore, his replacement should

get the four (4) hours that was already allotted for that shift. This is what occurred on May 28, 2012; Sgt. Quinlan was scheduled to work the 11pm-7am shift on Memorial Day, however he was out injured so he did not receive the holiday pay of 4 hours. Even though I worked the actual holiday in place of Sgt. Quinlan, I did not receive the four (4) hours straight pay pursuant to Article 6.

The communities of Acton, Boxborough, Littleton, Maynard, and Stow have received a Community Innovative Challenge grant from the State of Massachusetts. The purpose of the grant is to look at shared transportation resources among the five municipalities. As part of the first phase of the project the communities will collect GPS/GIS data from the existing transportation services. The purpose is to look at daily usage and see where efficiencies could be improved. To accomplish this goal we would like to place a mobile GIS/GPS unit on the *Maynard Road Runner* for a period of 60 days. These are temporary mobile units that will collect only data on routes and stops. Drivers and COA Directors will be made aware of the placement of these units.

- Water/Sewer bills completed & sent to Treasure/Collector for billing
- Awarded contract for Design through bidding for Mockingbird Station replacement
- Working with BOH on transition of solid waste and recycling operations, including redesign and mailing of calendar
- Consumer Confidence Report completed and mailed to every resident in Maynard

Highway Department:

- Repaired water trench on Nason St. also paved several other sunken trenches and pot holes at various locations in Town
- Installed new fencing at Highway Garage around equipment and recycling area
- Several complete mowing of Town Parks and Cemetery – wet cool weather required additional time for these operations

Water/Sewer Department:

- Well #4 well cleaned and pump rebuilt
- Began process of replacing and upgrade of chemical feed pumps – pumps were installed when plants were built and are now constantly breaking down requiring emergency repairs
- Continual testing of water supply and sources as mandated by DEP
- Daily monitoring of sewer pump stations and repairs and cleaning as necessary including clearing of sewer blocks
- Normal maintenance and repairs at Water treatment Plants

WWTP

- Included in the annual inspection report was the “Facility Grading Report” from the Board of Certification of Wastewater Treatment Facility Operators. The facility has been changed from a Grade IV facility to a Grade VI facility as a result of the upgrade completed last year. The grade of the facility is determined by a point system. We had a rating of 50 prior to the upgrade and now we have a rating of 66 due to addition of the following processes. Comag has a rating of 10, In Plant pumping has a rating of 3 and we are using 3 additional chemicals in our treatment process that accounts for 1 point per chemical, hence, a rating of 66 which is a Grade VI facility. This new grading means that the Plant Manager and the Asst Plant Manager must both hold a Grade VI Certification, which exists at this time. However, the certification of the weekend operator must now be a Grade V licensed operator instead of a Grade IV. This will have to be taken into account when a new operator is hired but the Board of Certification has indicated to me that the Board is willing to work with the Town on this matter since the job posting we placed 2 weeks ago is requiring a Grade IV certification because we had not received the “grading report” prior to posting the job.
- The clarifier contract with Weston and Sampson Services, CMR is proceeding and Clarifier # 2 has been ordered. I have received the specifications for Clarifier #1 and quotes have been requested and due July 6, 2012.

#### TRAINING ACTIVITIES

All shifts have been involved with the training of our new probationary firefighters. All together members completed over 117 hours of on-shift training in June in a variety of topics such as driver/operator, dispatch operations, and hydrant and drafting operations, building familiarity with walks through multiple buildings among other topics. Training also continued for our probationary firefighters as they become familiar with Maynard Fire Department procedures and methods.

## SHIFT PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

Multiple shifts continued work on r the pump of our forestry truck so the pump could be sent out for repair. This saved the fire department a *considerable* amount of money in labor allowing the pump to be fixed quicker. The pump is back in service and ready for use. I would like to thank all who helped out with this project!

We have continued developing and review standard operating guidelines and general orders. Most notably we have updated our responses to suspicious powders and or packages.

---

## ACTIONS OF NOTE:

After 24 years of service to the community of Maynard, Captain Patrick Sullivan has tendered his resignation to take the job of Fire Chief for Lunenburg, Massachusetts. I would like to personally thank Captain Sullivan for his years of service and wish him luck moving forward.

With the departure of Captain Sullivan, a vacancy in the Captains ranks has been created and will be filled with the promotion of John King who will take over as shift commander of Group 2 on July 17<sup>th</sup>, please welcome me in wishing him luck in his new position. We have also hired Daniel Gould to fill the firefighter position being created with the promotion of John King, he will start his career as a Maynard Firefighter on July 16<sup>th</sup>.

Fire department crews continued testing and evaluating different types of vehicle extrication equipment in anticipation of buying an updated unit. Crews are evaluating different types of units in an effort to determine the best value for the community.

We have submitted a grant request with the Federal Emergency Management Agency under the Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program. This grant would enable us to purchase a new fire engine at a cost of over \$400,000.00 as well as new portable radio equipment, firefighter protective clothing and spare self-contained breathing apparatus cylinder's. This grant works on a %5 match by the municipality if it is awarded, however, this would save the community about \$600,000.00 in the next few years.

Our public education campaign has continued and we have added some very important safety information to both the Fire Department website and our Maynard Fire Department Facebook Page. Look for more going forward.


