NEW BUSINESS

Pursuit of National Register Status for Assabet Woolen Mill

Steve Wood briefed the Commission on the concept of National Register status for the Mill complex, with emphasis on it's Civil War historical significance. Preliminary research indicates that there may not be much in the way of constraints on the private property rights of the owners, which has been a major roadblock with the owners when it was raised in the past. The Commission encouraged Steve to continue his efforts.

OLD BUSINESS

Glenwood Cemetery Fence

Commission priorities for use of remaining funds (if any):

- 1) Replace the curved rail along the receiving tomb wall with a picket fence style railing at or below the height of the current rail.
- 2) Remove and/or replace chain link fence separating Maynard Family Tomb and Glenwood Cemetery.
- 3) Replace an additional portion of chain link fence along Great Road

Discussed possible location(s) for and configuration of sign(s). Cost estimates for signs will be obtained -- first considering lightweight material (similar to our historical markers).

Historic Marker Candidates

Lee proposed two sites:

- 1) Case Block & Annex (1900)
- 2) Holy Annunciation Orthodox Church (1916)

The Commission agreed these were fine candidates for 2013.
