

Maynard Recreation Committee Meeting - 8pm
Thursday, December 9, 2010 - held at Memorial Gym

1. Public Open Floor - No comments

2. Updates:

- Open Meeting Law - Each member was presented with the Open Meeting Law Guide to review and sign before the January 2011 meeting.

GBeharral provided updates to the Gym:

- Electrical updates: ½ light bulbs replaces; time clock side lights replaced. Still want to add motion sensors or timers to bathroom and lobby lights.
- Heat: Combustion Service came out and checked system. 4inch pipe placed to prevent leaking; Wall furnace had oil added; back lobby heater was fixed. GBeharral is going to contact previous heat vendor to see if we can recoup funds for repair work on the back lobby heater.
- Art Space boiler was not working recently. One day it was 50degrees in the gym. Art Space fixed it and heat was back. Gym pass 13% of heating bill. This was set in the original Art Space contract. The gym is 13% of the total Art Space/Gym footage.
- Capital requests for the gym's own heat system has been submitted.
- Backboards were replaced.
- Cleaning -GBeharral has been cleaning up 1x week. Trash will be picked up weekly & recycling will be picked up 2x month .
- New benches are in the lobby for footwear changes.
- MChambers will get a flag case for a flag donated by Bill Duggan.
- Christmas parade - about 15 kids and 6 adults participated in the parade. Cost \$80 for supplies, pizza & candy.
- Basketball update - 77 kids registered which is down from last yr (95 kids). 16 coaches all volunteers who have been Cori'd. Tom Hickey is doing a great job with the refs. May look to do a skills assessment on players in the future to balance teams. Next month will ask parents & THickey on how the program ran. Season ends in March. In April, we will review basketball programs.

Fall/Winter updates:

- HS Futsol 16-18 kids have shown up
- Futsol - forms were due yesterday. 62 kids signed up which is up from last yr. Games begins in Jan. Age groups K-3, Gr4-6, Gr6-8
- Open Gym - 1st session is almost over. 17 kids in grades k-4. Session 2 has 16-18 kids signed up.
- Ski Program - Pfalzone not in attendance to give update. Less kids than last yr (approx 60kids down from 90 last yr) Rec receives no money for this. One scholarship request. Parent will volunteer and scholarship funds coming from Rec, Town Hall, and Police Dept.
- Lego - 2wks left. Program was very successful and will run again next summer.
- Book Class - Make a book for Gr 1-3 going well
- Art Classes - for Toddler/Preschool and Elem age kids. Instructor may adjust programming in spring, but going well.
- Gym Rentals - Gym is rented for volleyball, co-ed adult soccer, hoops clinic, 3 birthday parties, boot camp, dance classes, lunchtime hoops (adult), and Imago school.
- Rental receipts from Jul'10 - Dec is \$3026.

 - Income from sports receipts were discussed
 - Becky Mosca in Selectmen's office keeps track of all income/payables for Recreation.
 6. New Business:
 - Buy a brick program - email sent out about program and the Beacon Villager recently wrote an article about it. Six families have purchased so far. Each will receive an email for confirmation & approval.
 - Combustion Service bill for \$2780 was paid out of article money.
 - Old roofing bills still coming in.
 - Tops Soccer program was discussed. It's a special needs soccer program that Mass Youth Soccer helps coordinate. Rec may look at running one in the spring.
