



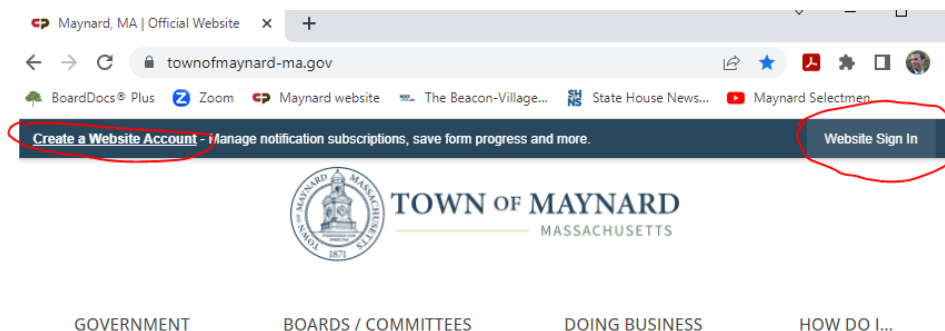
TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT



July 5, 2023

ADMINISTRATION:

- The town's [new website](#) allows for residents to create a log in and register to receive notifications, alerts, and other information relative to their interests. Committee members can also request "Author" permissions to edit their specific body's webpage to be published by a town staff "Administrator".



- Town Administrator (TA) Greg Johnson and Human Resources (HR) Manager Stephanie Duggan are conducting a search for a new Town Accountant.
- Town Offices are closed on Monday July 3 and Tuesday July 4 in observance of the Independence Day holiday.
- TA Johnson and HR Manager Duggan are conducting regular collective bargaining agreement negotiations with NEPBA Police unions (Patrolmen and Superior Officers), and with AFSCME Clerical Union. Individual personnel employment agreements to be negotiated include: Police Chief; Deputy Police Chief; Planning Director; and, Human Resources Manager.

- TA Johnson is planning to attend the Massachusetts Municipal Managers Association (MMMA) Conference on Thursday July 20 in Sandwich, MA.
- TA Johnson plans to use Personal Time Off (PTO) for vacation on Friday, July 28, and August 14-18, 2023.
- TA Johnson is conducting procurement procedures for multiple contracts: Owners Project Manager (OPM) for Alumni Field Bleacher design and construction; Engineering Review consulting services for the Planning Board; Conservation and Wetland Regulation and Planning Consulting Services for the Conservation Commission; and, Town Engineering Services.

Maynard Fixit Clinic

On Saturday, June 24, the Library and Green Maynard held our first-ever Fixit Clinic, where people could bring their broken items and work with volunteers on assessment and possible repair. Forty-five attendees and volunteers participated, over 30 items were brought for repair, and most items were fixed or advice was given on next steps. Repaired items included a bike, birdhouse, doll, jacket, lamp, pants, sewing machine, snow blower, stroller, stuffed animal toys, umbrella, and weed wacker. There was a great buzz of excitement and community cooperation in the room. THANK YOU to our wonderful volunteer fixit coaches! Based on the enthusiastic turnout and feedback, we plan to hold another clinic over the coming year.
