



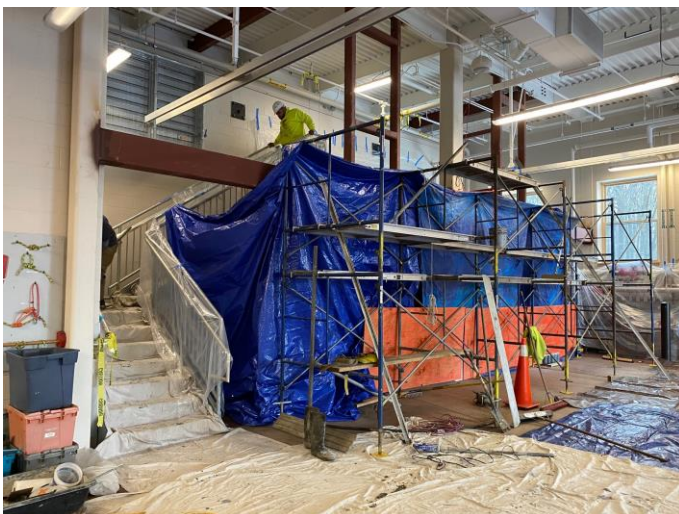
TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

February 6, 2024



ADMINISTRATION

- Town offices scheduled to be closed: Monday, February 19, 2024, in observance of Washington's Birthday.
- Town Administrator (TA) Johnson attended the Finance Committee on Monday, February 5, 2024.
- The Town Charter defined Joint Budget Review meeting is scheduled for Saturday, February 10, 2024 at the Maynard Fire Station on Sudbury Street.
- TA Johnson and Assistant Town Administrator (ATA) Stephanie Duggan are conducting regular collective bargaining agreement negotiations with the AFSCME Clerical Union, and have commenced negotiations with the IAFF Fire Fighters Local 1947 union. We are expecting to commence negotiations with Public Safety Tele-Communicators NEPBA Local 114 dispatchers union. Individual personnel employment agreements to be negotiated include the Planning Director.
- The deadline of February 9, 2024 was issued for submissions to the Annual Town Report. Submissions can be delivered to Executive Assistant Greg Wilson in the Town Administrator's Office.

- Reminder to all public drinking water customers: Please be advised that an instruction mailer will be going out to Maynard residents regarding an upcoming water service line review. To stay in compliance with the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) recent Lead and Copper Rule Revisions, we will be collecting data on the age of homes, water mains, and service lines in this water service inventory project. The mail notice will include detailed instructions for self-reporting information to assist the Town in this effort. It will also include information for scheduling a service line identification appointment. Thank you for your participation and supporting our Town and the community.
- As part of the recent water main break / repair located on Summer street on Sunday January 28th, Maynard's water department was able to isolate, locate and expedite repairs in an efficient and effective time. This is due to recent improvements in equipment, and operation methods incorporated with ever evolving distribution improvements in our infrastructure. Regarding the Summer Street west bound

road closure, we have secured a contractor to pave the large, impacted area of the travel lane and are anticipating the road being fully opened by end of day Friday, February 2nd.

Remarks were made by the Chair of the Library Trustees, the current and former Library Directors, the President of the Friends of the Library, and current and former colleagues. Mark received citations from the town (presented by Select Board members Jeff Swanberg and David Gavin) and the Massachusetts Senate honoring his 25 years of service, and he was given a coat embroidered with the Library and Town logos. Mark led the gathering in a kazoo performance. He described the celebration as "being enveloped in a wonderful cloud of love."



Winter Reads Bingo Challenge

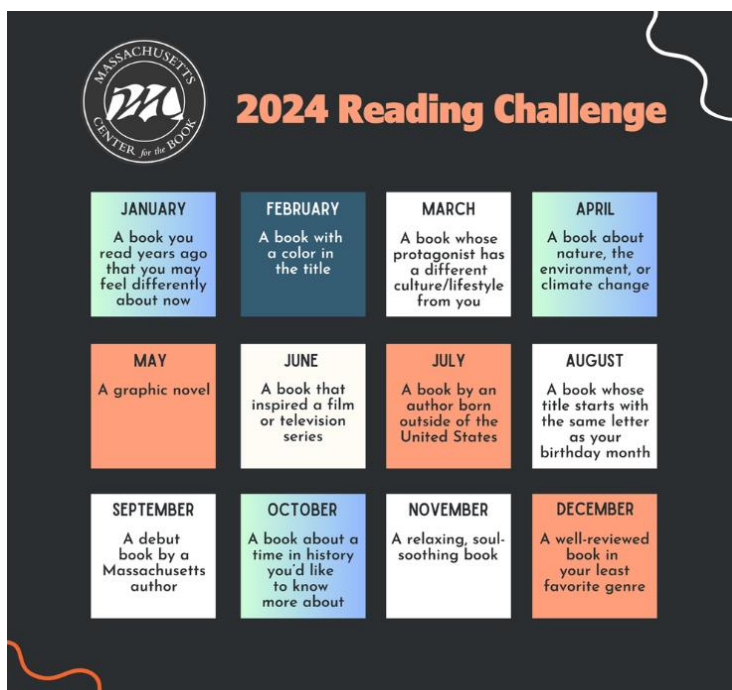

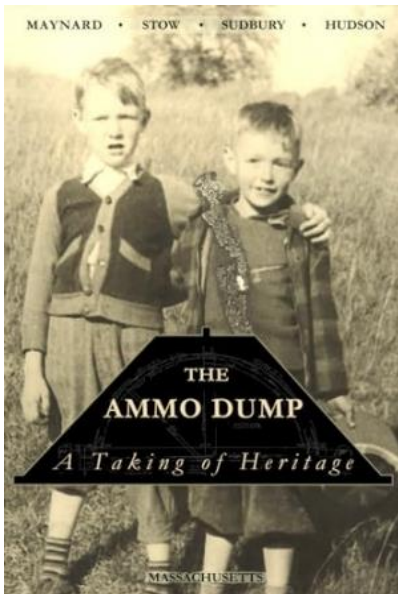

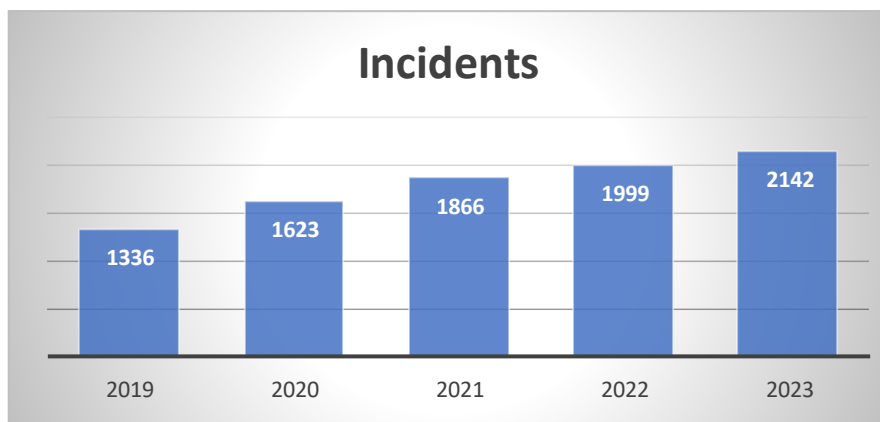

FIRE DEPARTMENT:



Our call volume has increased as it has in the past few years. In 2023 we responded to 2,142 incidents. The complete report including the breakdown of incidents is still in the process. Our calls have increased by 60.33% in the past five years.



In collaboration with the Maynard Fire Department, Communications Department, Fowler School, and Police Department – we have completed the installation and acceptance test of the Bi-Directional Amplifier (BDA) in the Fowler School. This is an increase in the public safety of the schools allowing police and fire radio transmissions to now be able to be sent and received while in the Fowler School. This is an increase in safety for our students, staff, and first responders. Thank you to the Select Board for supporting this asset to the community.



Construction is almost completed on our training mezzanine. This is going to be an invaluable resource for our firefighters as well as others in the area. We will be able to conduct training including but not limited to; Firefighter bailouts, Rescues, Ladder drills, Hose handling and attacks, Technical Rescues, RIT, Search and rescue, and others. This resource will allow us to host technical rescue classes here for our department as well as provide a training facility for other departments in our district.

Congratulations to firefighters James McGowan and Alan Portis for completing and becoming Pro-Board Certified in Fire Officer I. Chief Lawless and FF. Travis Gross completed Fire Prevention Officer I. Both 5-week classes were taught by Massachusetts Fire Academy and hosted at the Maynard Fire Department in

our Training room. Our new station is being utilized by firefighters in the Commonwealth, sharing knowledge and increasing our skill set!
