[Friends of Maynard Softball is requesting the full amount of \\$150,000 from the CPA for this project.](#) The primary objective of the project is to replace the aging and unsafe fencing at Keenan Girls Softball Field with new and safe fencing. In addition, safety netting will be installed along the first and third baselines to protect spectators and pedestrians.

3. Goals: What are the specific objectives of the proposed project? Who will benefit and why? How will success be measured? [Our primary objective is to make Keenan Girls Softball Field a safe place for our sports teams and community to play at.](#) The current fence is estimated to be over 30 years old and has a number of safety hazards, including broken gates that do not close, lack of a railing along bottom of fence has created a number of gaps between the fence and the ground and most dangerous of all is the sharp points of the fence protruding over the top railing. There is also no safety netting around the field and this creates a safety issue for both spectators and pedestrians walking by heading to other activities at Alumni.

Keenan Girls Softball Field is the only regulation size softball field in Maynard. The primary beneficiaries of this field renovation will be the hundreds of female athletes that need this field to play softball. There are teams from both the Maynard School District as well as Assabet Valley Little League that rely on this field to play softball for Maynard. In addition, it would also benefit members of our community that want to come to the field when it is not being used to play with their children, to teach them the game of softball.

Measuring success in terms of numbers is not a simple task. Our organizations and the other organizations that use this field will measure success by having a field that is safe of hazards to those playing and watching and to have a home field they can be proud of.

4. Community Need: Why is this project needed? Does it address needs identified in existing Town or regional plans, or non-profit organizations, or in community discussions? The project is needed because the current fence is unsafe to the athletes using this field. The field is used by the Middle School, High School Junior Varsity, High School Varsity, Assabet Valley Little League, and various club teams. This field is used for practices and games spring, summer and fall. The fencing at the adjacent boys baseball field has been replaced within the last 15 years and is safe and esthetically pleasing. Upgrading this fence will not only eliminate the immediate safety issue of the field but will increase the overall appearance of the Alumni Field Complex.

5. Community Support: What is the nature and level of support and/or opposition for this project? In particular, which Town Boards/Committees/Departments or community organizations have you consulted/collaborated with? The Friends of Maynard Softball has requested support from the Maynard Public Schools, the Maynard School Committee, Assabet Valley Little League and the Recreation Department. Although these organizations and stake holders could not offer us financial support they are all supportive of this initiative to replace the unsafe fence at Keenan Girls Softball Field.

6. Budget: What is the total budget for the project and how will CPA funds be spent? Provide written estimates to substantiate proposed costs. Include a two to five-year budget, if appropriate. (NOTE: CPA funds may NOT be used for general maintenance purposes.) The total package would be approximately \$150,000 for the materials and installation. CPA funds would be used to pay for the entire cost of the project. There is no general maintenance funds needed for the fence/netting project.

Is there any revenue potential for this project? At this time, the Maynard Public Schools could not commit to any funding for this project. The Friends of Maynard Softball has secured a private donation from MacDonald Properties for construction of two dugouts to include: poured concrete flooring with an open lean-to style overhang to protect players from balls and elements and improve the overall appearance of the field.

8. Timeline: What is the schedule for project implementation? Include a timeline for critical elements, expenditures, and receipt of other funds, if any. The installation of the fence/ netting would begin as soon as the project is approved by CPC and Town of Maynard.

2. What resources are the schools or Town willing to provide? [Due to regulations limiting the amount of money that schools can spend on non-instructional facility related expenses, the Maynard Public School does not have any funding available for field or sports facility upgrades or repairs.](#)
3. What is the concrete maintenance plan? [There is minimal maintenance to the fence and netting. If there is a minor repair to the fence or a gate, AVLL has a fund to make future repairs to the fence and netting. School has not identified any funds for maintenance](#)
4. What are other field users willing to contribute? [AVLL does have a small fund available should any future fence repairs be needed. AVLL will be contributing to field maintenance to include grading and infield repairs of areas that currently collect rain water. This will improve the drainage of the field. We understand this does not directly relate to the fence but we wanted you to be aware of AVLL's contributions to the overall improvement of the girls softball field. Friends of Maynard Softball has secured a in kind donation to have the infield and turf of Keenan field professionally maintained for the 2022-2023 season. Turf improvement has been needed due to the increase usage of the field.](#)
5. Do we have written permission from the field owner? Please confirm that the School is the owner and has given permission. [Yes, we have written permission from the Maynard Public Schools to replace the fence and add safety netting. The field is MPS property and under its jurisdiction.](#)

Dear Community Preservation Committee Members,

At its meeting on Thursday, September 23, 2021, the Maynard School Committee (MSC) voted unanimously to permit Friends of Maynard Softball to apply for Community Preservation Committee (CPC) funding to improve the conditions of the Keenan softball field. The request for permission was presented by Jason Raschi, who explained the dire need for a new fence around the field and safety netting behind the home plate.

Assabet Valley Little League (AVLL) softball has developed into a robust program in Maynard due to the efforts of Mr. Raschi and other members of Friends of Maynard Softball. Between AVLL and Maynard Public Schools (MPS) softball, Keenan Field has seen a lot of use in recent years. Normal wear and tear, in addition to outdoor seasonal degradation, have created several safety concerns that currently require immediate attention. Unfortunately, because of regulations limiting the amount of money school districts are allowed to spend on non-instructional facility-related expenses, MPS cannot contribute towards these athletic field enhancements at this time.

The MSC can attest to the fact that Keenan Field is MPS's property and under its jurisdiction. Justin DeMarco, Director of the Maynard Department of Public Works, can confirm this attestation. The MSC has reviewed Mr. Raschi's completed application and fully supports it. Mr. Raschi has not only taken the initiative to pursue funding, but he has also secured the potential donations of dugouts and a new scoreboard. We are very grateful for Mr. Raschi's and the Friends of Maynard Softball's work towards improving Keenan Field. The MSC is willing to enter into a grant agreement with the CPC to oversee the administering and disbursing of any grant funds awarded, if needed.

Friends of Maynard Softball is seeking grant funding for fencing and netting surrounding Keenan field, which requires little to no ongoing maintenance. The MSC understands that CPC funds may not be used for ongoing maintenance purposes. Although not part of this grant application, MPS, in collaboration with various community and town stakeholders, is also working towards the development of an ongoing maintenance strategy for all school fields.

Assabet Valley Little League (AVLL) is writing to support Jason Raschi in his attempts to secure Community Preservation Committee (CPC) funds to be applied to Keenan softball field at Maynard High School. This effort is the culmination of years of work to provide a clean and safe environment for local children to learn about and master the sport of softball.

The current field was established more than 30 years ago, and since then very little has been to update the area. AVLL, with a very limited budget, has attempted to maintain the playing conditions and address specific safety issues that arise. While we have been successful at patching and covering problem areas, the field is in a state that most would agree needs to be addressed. The fences are in disrepair and no amount of patchwork can help them at this point. The fence should be raised by at least 10 feet on the first base side as hard-hit foul balls routinely leave the field. There have been instances of spectators being struck by these balls. The entire fence needs to be replaced, safety netting should be installed, and the dugouts need to be leveled, and be made safe from foul balls and the elements. The updates made would have a similar appearance to DJ's baseball field, located immediately to the east of the softball field. Updates to the baseball field were made more than 10 years ago, and with the help of field maintenance by AVLL, have withstood the test of time and keep the field in very good condition, but more importantly provide a safe environment for the children to play and learn in.

While AVLL has done its best to maintain the softball field, after more than 30 years it is time for a major renovation. We are committed to helping the process to the extent possible and will continue to care for the maintenance of the playing surface. We are not able to generate nearly enough money to replace the fence. It is our hope that with Jason's efforts, and the cooperation of the CPC, Maynard High School, and the town of Maynard, Keenan field can once again become a safe spot for the youth of Maynard, and many other towns, to learn and excel at America's pastime.





Who we are and why we are here




- Friends of Maynard Softball is a non-profit organization founded with the purpose of providing young female softball players the financial support needed to participate in competitive softball while positively representing our community.

Proposed Field Updates, Annual Maintenance and Funding Sources



- Fence and back stop- \$96,000
 - CPC Grant Application
- Safety netting- \$53,000
 - CPC Grant Application
- Dugouts with overhead cover- \$10,000-\$12,000
 - Donation secured by Friends of Maynard Softball. Local general contractor will construct at no cost
- Maynard Tiger Softball Dugout Screens- \$800
 - Maynard Softball Players in conjunction with Friends of Maynard Softball will be fundraising to purchase the screens for their field
- Professional Field Maintenance- \$6500 per year
