Sienna's Girl Scout Gold Award AED Project is moving full steam ahead. She has successfully raised all necessary funds to bring the project to life, and it is nearly ready for launch. All five ZOLL AEDs have been ordered — with one generously donated by ZOLL — and the stand-alone cabinets are on the way. We are now finalizing installation details. Sienna's goal is to have every unit in place before the start of Maynard's sports season. Recently, Sienna and Chief Lawless toured the ZOLL factory, meeting with the President and other executives who were inspired by the work she is doing for Maynard. They noted that her vision aligns perfectly with ZOLL's *"Anything Can Happen – Anyone Can Help"* campaign. Maynard Fire and Police participated in FEMA's Family Day at the bunker on Old Marlboro Road. This event was a great opportunity to engage with children and families, showcase our trucks, and learn more about FEMA's available resources. We have scheduled tours of the facility for all department employees this fall. Last year, our Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) was hosted at the bunker, and we have now planned a training session for the LEPC later this year focused on navigating FEMA reimbursement processes in the event of a natural disaster in our community. Collaborating with FEMA and other partner agencies continues to strengthen our preparedness and response capabilities.



This summer, Maynard has experienced several extreme heat events. In response, we opened our cooling center and used our social media platforms to share information on staying cool, preparing for high temperatures, and recognizing the signs of heat-related illness. We also encouraged residents to check on neighbors — particularly seniors and vulnerable individuals — as part of our commitment to keeping Maynard “community strong.” These efforts are part of our broader focus on community preparedness, ensuring residents have the knowledge, resources, and support to stay safe during severe weather events.



Maynard Fire and Police conducted our annual school walkthroughs and safety inspections at Green Meadow, Fowler, and Maynard High School. This event is mutually beneficial — it ensures our schools are safe and ready for students’ return, while also providing police and fire personnel with important familiarity of the buildings. I would like to thank the school staff, custodians, facilities managers, and administration for the exceptional condition of all three schools. Without a doubt, this year the facilities were the most prepared we have ever seen.


