ADMINISTRATION

- Town Administrator Johnson used bereavement time for Thursday and Friday, October 30 and 31, 2025.
- TA Johnson thanks all the officials, staff, election officials and voters for their work and participation in the successful execution of the Special Town Meeting held Monday, October 27, 2025.
- Town offices will be closed Tuesday, November 11, 2025 in observance of Veterans Day.
- Assistant Town Administrator (ATA) Stephanie Duggan was a TA Johnson and ATA Duggan continue negotiations with LIUNA Professionals and LIUNA Laborers (DPW), and are expecting to initiate negotiations with AFSCME Clerical and NEPBA Police.

- The Council on Aging is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The COA provides information and referrals for supportive services including home care, health insurance counseling, fuel assistance, food resources, housing, legal issues, public assistance programs, and transportation. The Council on Aging accepts and lends durable medical equipment.
- The Council on Aging van service provides transportation Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Destinations include medical appointments, grocery stores.
