For the last month I dreamt about the birds I saw, woke with nervous excitement before every morning adventure and walked an injured knee into more injury with unstoppable fervor.

And yet, a different type of party continues the backyard. The male House Finch boasts a bright raspberry red head and breast and prances up and down the pole, two handsome Red Breasted Grosbeaks chase each other on and off their territories and a Baltimore Oriole explores where to hang its knitted nest. The neighbor’s birdhouses have posted full occupancy signs as robins carry pine needles and sparrows struggle with grasses. My wren nest box is still awaiting guests but the House Wrens are furiously singing just feet way. And just down the hill the pond is home to 15 goslings doing significant damage to the owner’s well maintained lawn.

I’m going to sit back, rest my knee and enjoy the fun!

## Annual Town Meeting and Fiscal Year 2019

On May 21, 2018, we held our annual town meeting at the Fowler School. Twenty-six articles were presented including standards like accepting the Town Report, authorizing the sale of obsolete equipment, a series of by-law updates, and the FY19 budget.

The Town approved all articles presented except Article 4 which asked for permission to sell the Coolidge School. This article proved to be the most debated with concerns that the Town was not considering protecting the historic aspects of the building and the use of the adjacent park for sledding in the winter. Article 17 authorized use of \$832,000 from Capital Stabilization funds for Phase 2 of the Fire Department Building plan. This money will create construction documents and determine a price for construction. Financing of construction will require another Town Meeting vote, once the costs are known and the Town feels the money is available. The Town hopes to use available capital and new growth funds and avoid using a debt exclusion to build the fire station.

Two articles were passed that authorize borrowing for water and sewer construction projects. These borrowings will be repaid over 20 years with funds available within the water & sewer capital budget.

Article 26, the budget article, was for \$42,231,539.00 – a 3.88% increase over this year. The increase is mostly in the school budget which increased about 6.45%. The Town budgets increased 1.8%.

Fiscal 2019 starts on July 1, and it looks to be an exciting year. Maynard Crossing received its first building permits on May 22, 2019. More will follow and by mid-summer, vertical construction should be noticed on the site. The Town will be under construction for most of the next few years – 129 Parker, seven parcels in the downtown, roads, sidewalks, and other infrastructure projects are all getting started in the immediate future.


The Council on Aging van runs from **7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** and provides low cost transportation to local hospitals, doctors, dentists, health care providers, pharmacies, as well as banks, the post office and to the Senior Center on 50 Brown Street in Maynard.

Arrangements must be made one day in advance before 1:30 p.m. (it is best to call several days in advance). A donation of \$1 is requested each time you get on the van. Transportation to the COA is free! Anyone with weekly appointments (same time, same day) must arrange for a standing pickup. If you decide not to go you **MUST** notify the dispatch office.

Residents of Maynard, 60 years of age or older and handicapped persons of any age, may use the van. If the rider is handicapped in any way, please mention this when scheduling the pickup so any accommodations may be made in advance. Pickups may begin 15 minutes before the scheduled time to accommodate more than one passenger. The van will wait no longer than 5 minutes for a passenger to emerge at which time the driver will call the office to report the "no show" and leave for the next pickup. On very busy days the van can get behind schedule.

## Senior Parking Stickers

The Town of Maynard has a Senior Parking Sticker program that allows residents who are 62 years old or older to park at any metered space free of charge for up to 2 hours. Residents interested in the program should bring their license and registration to the Maynard Police Station (197 Main St.) to be issued a sticker.

## REP. KATE HOGAN'S SENIOR NEWS JUNE 2018

### FY19 House Budget

As spring arrives in Massachusetts, so too does the state budget process for Fiscal Year 2019. The intention of the House budget, passed in late April, is to serve as a blueprint for continued economic growth in Massachusetts while making critical investments in programs and services across the Commonwealth. As I write this update, the budget is being considered in the Senate and will be signed by the Governor this summer.

The House of Representatives remains committed to serving the unique needs of our growing senior population. Elder programs that received funding in the FY19 House budget include:

- **Councils on Aging:** Municipal COAs are the first stop on the elder care continuum and provide invaluable services and resources to the seniors in our communities. The FY19 House budget increases the Councils on Aging formula grant from \$10 to \$12 per individual, per year.
- **Home Care Services:** The Executive Office of Elder Affairs provides Home Care services to 45,000 elders each month; this includes home health services, personal emergency response, grocery shopping/delivery and more.
- **Supportive Senior Housing:** The Supportive Senior Housing Initiative provides a supportive living environment in state-funded public elderly and disabled housing.
- **Elder Protective Services:** These services allow for the investigation of elder abuse and neglect.
- **Elder Nutrition, including Meals on Wheels:** 27 nutrition programs located throughout the state serve over 9.1 million meals to seniors each year.
- **Elder Homeless Placement:** The FY19 budget provides funding for assessment, placement, and homelessness prevention services for homeless and at-risk elders.

I was proud to sponsor an amendment to the House budget that increased funding for Massachusetts' Independent Living Centers (ILCs), bringing funding for FY19 up to \$6.3 million. There are 11 ILCs across Massachusetts that provide services and advocacy by and for people with all types of disabilities, including 30,000 Massachusetts residents of all ages and abilities. The MetroWest Center for Independent Living empowers individuals with disabilities in our region with the practical skills and self-confidence they need to take control over their lives and become active members of the communities in which they live.

### Local Transportation

On behalf of my district, I secured \$75,000 in the FY19 House budget to be used for the Maynard & Acton Senior Shuttle. This program provides transportation for approximately 4,000 individual appointments per year. The vans are most often used to bring seniors to appointments at Emerson Hospital in Concord; as a result, those who need transportation for local appointments, grocery shopping and to-and-from the Council on Aging are limited to odd time slots or long waits because the vans must wait for the appointments at Emerson to finish before returning to Maynard or Acton. This funding will add an additional driver for a van exclusively dedicated to medical trips in order to provide local seniors with the freedom to maintain their appointments and independence.


