

Americans with Disabilities Act Committee

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) was created by the federal government in 1990 to protect the rights of citizens facing the challenge of life with a physical or mental impairment. Most of us are familiar with how the ADA has created access improvements into public facilities – automatic door openers, ramps, and handicapped accessible restrooms, for example. The Act also mandates other types of public accommodations like TTY phones and machine 'readers' to enable communication with the hearing or visually impaired. Municipalities were required to create 'transition plans' documenting how they would migrate to a fully accessible community. Maynard created its plan in 1993 and has implemented many of its plans.

In 2017, the Town received a grant from the Massachusetts Office of Disabilities to update its ADA Transition Plan. The rewrite has been drafted and it includes new provisions for enabling citizens to ask for accommodations, appoints an employee as a point of contact, and outlines new physical and electronic access improvements to be implemented in the coming years.

Before submitting the plan to the Commonwealth for acceptance, public input is required. In addition, a committee must be re-established (current one is dormant) which will inform capital planning, make budget recommendations, and assist citizens and the town in determining and establishing proper accommodations in the future.

The draft plan is available on the Town Website at townofmaynard-ma.gov/gov/committees/ada/ or by request at the Town Administrator's Office. Anyone interested in serving on the ADA Committee should also contact the Town Administrator's Office for details.

The Council on Aging has recently received several calls reporting one senior's phone number showing up on another's callerID when no there had been no attempt to make contact. We felt it was important to share information about this new type of scamming as doctor's office numbers or local businesses could show up as well.

"Neighbor Spoofing"

Scammers can mimic your area code and phone number prefix to make their calls look local. If you've been getting inundated with incoming phone calls that look a lot like your own number, you're not alone.

This year has seen a spike in the practice dubbed "neighbor spoofing" — scammers and telemarketers using Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) software to mimic your area code and three-number prefix to make it appear as if an incoming call is originating from near your own location. The idea, security experts say, is that you're more likely to answer an unfamiliar number if it looks close to yours — thinking it could be coming from your doctor's office, or your child or grandchild's school.

But once you pick up, it's the same old robocall scam. The caller might pose as a debt collector or a travel company offering vacation deals — whatever it takes to separate you from your money.

The best advice, according to experts, is to ignore unknown numbers, even those that appear to be coming from your local area. That's because once you pick up and engage with the call, you're telling the software that yours is a real number, and you may then receive even more calls.

In addition, it's a good idea not to use your phone number to sign up for services— online or in-person— if it's not required. Scammers get their contacts from all sorts of sources, and it's best to try to stay off as many lists as possible. And, if you haven't already, sign up for the FTC's Do Not Call registry — it may not keep away the scam artists, but it should cut down on calls from telemarketers.




Evening Cookbook Club in July

Borrow the cookbook at the Circulation Desk, select a recipe and prepare it for the potluck dinner on the 17th. Drinks and place settings provided.



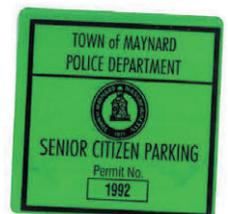
The Council on Aging van runs from **7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.** and provides low cost transportation to local hospitals, doctors, dentists, health care providers, pharmacies, as well as banks, the post office and to the Senior Center on 50 Brown Street in Maynard.

Arrangements must be made one day in advance before 1:30 p.m. (it is best to call several days in advance). A donation of \$1 is requested each time you get on the van. Transportation to the COA is free! Anyone with weekly appointments (same time, same day) must arrange for a standing pickup. If you decide not to go you **MUST** notify the dispatch office.

Residents of Maynard, 60 years of age or older and handicapped persons of any age, may use the van. If the rider is handicapped in any way, please mention this when scheduling the pickup so any accommodations may be made in advance. Pickups may begin 15 minutes before the scheduled time to accommodate more than one passenger. The van will wait no longer than 5 minutes for a passenger to emerge at which time the driver will call the office to report the "no show" and leave for the next pickup. On very busy days the van can get behind schedule.

Senior Parking Stickers

The Town of Maynard has a Senior Parking Sticker program that allows residents who are 62 years old or older to park at any metered space free of charge for up to 2 hours. Residents interested in the program should bring their license and registration to the Maynard Police Station (197 Main St.) to be issued a sticker.

Greetings from the Maynard Historical Society #3 (July 2018)

Welcome to the next Maynard Historical puzzle. This is the third installment in an ongoing series of articles in the Maynard Council on Aging newsletter where we will discuss more about what we are doing at the Historical Society and how you can help.

Last month we featured a photograph of a house with the word "Maynard's" on the front lawn. Kathy Corrigan identified it as a family-owned lodge near Moosehead Lake called "Maynard's in Maine". At this time we don't know if there is any connection to Maynard Maynards. Regardless, another puzzle solved! Thank you Kathy!

Our next unknown item has a definite connection to the town: it is a photograph of a Maynard baseball team. If you can identify the team, perhaps when the photograph might have been taken (looks to be in the 1960s), and any of the players names that would be fantastic.

We have numerous other team photographs (baseball, football, track, cricket, etc.) in the collection, many without names. If you stumble upon one that you can help us with a name or some other detail, please contact us. Just search for "team" and you'll see dozens of them.

Memorial Day Remarks

To all the Veterans here today, our grateful nation and our proud Commonwealth thank you for your service and your sacrifice.

President Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address described battle sites such as these as Hallowed Ground: holy and sacred.

Lincoln also said that those left behind – we, the living - are responsible to these heroes so that the "dead shall not have died in vain."

For these battles are always met by young Americans who give their last measure of devotion. Who offer up their future to our sacred trust to create a more perfect union.

And these loved ones (and their families) are ever our responsibility as an American Family. If we love our country we must love and honor our heroes and care for their families.

Let our battle grounds (our hallowed grounds) help guide us on a path to greater understanding as a nation in an ever changing world, as countrymen who can respect each other and work across differences and across aisles, and as Americans who believe we can meet 21st century challenges and lead by example as well as strength.

Lincoln dedicated the Soldiers' National Cemetery in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania on the afternoon of Thursday, November 19, 1863 – four and a half months after the Union armies defeated those of the Confederacy at the Battle of Gettysburg. At the dedication, he pledged that our nation would have a new birth of freedom and that a government of the people, by the people and for the people shall not perish from the earth.

God Bless and protect those in harm's way; God Bless all our Veterans; God Bless the great Commonwealth of Massachusetts & God Bless America.
